□ **Mon.** **Our own Bonnie Kee** is in the final week of a short-term trip in Quito, Ecuador. Continue to pray for her health and stamina as she ministers to children, women, & families thru local pastors and translators.

□ **Tues.** **N & J** were with us Sunday. They will be in the USA visiting family & supporting churches thru mid-September. Pray for their refreshment in the USA & anticipation to go back to the field living with their host family. They have been on the field for a year, have learned much of the culture and enough language to carry on simple conversations. Pray they will be ready for this next phase of ministry when they return to the field in mid-September.

□ **Wed.** **Jo Shetler, Wycliffe, NC.** Jo is in Florida to take part in Youth with a Mission (YWAM) training school representing Wycliffe and Bible Translation & Scripture Engagement. During the week she will do a shortened *Culture meets Scripture* workshop & mix with students & YWAM Staff. Pray for her stamina as this is her first long trip in 2 years.

□ **Thur.** **Last week Becca Ashton, CRU, Hungary,** was in Albania helping as a facilitator in English Camp & **Alban & Dori Pasho, CRU, Albania,** were facilitating a German Camp with workers from Switzerland. Pray that the participants in both camps were greatly impacted by the personal and spiritual discussions that are part of the camps, and that their hearts have been opened to learning more about Jesus.

□ **Fri. and □ Sat.** **Mark & Joanne Mackey, former GBC family of missionaries, who established Zaporozhye Bible Seminary (ZBS) in UKRAINE.** Mark is in phone contact almost daily with graduates of the Seminary who are working on behalf of the people of Ukraine. Mark tells stories of those who work to feed and house displaced folks, a pastor who was imprisoned after his church was taken over by the Russian soldiers, a couple doing counseling for families facing displacement & grief for what has been lost, churches holding many services a week to pray for their nation in the worsening conflict, and one working as a translator of radio broadcasts of Christian programs. He also told a heartrending story of one who organized a convoy of hundreds of vehicles that were leaving the country but had to stop at multiple Russian checkpoints where papers were “inspected.” Passengers waited days in the vehicles in the heat of summer, without extra food or comforts as occupying soldiers flaunted their domination. Pray for God’s care for the people of the Ukraine thru this horrendous time in their lives and the future of their country.
